Before We Start: Not a Fan of Purple or Green?



Say No More!

This can be easily changed once you configure **your brand**.


“My Brand?”

Yes, you read that correctly. If you [set up your brand](#) in Scroll PDF Exporter, this template will automatically apply your brand colors, fonts, and logo to it. No changes needed!



Keep Information to the Point

...and don't forget to open your presentation with a bold statement. Maybe even a quote?

 Like this one which uses the 'quote' style in Confluence.



Each H1 Will Break to a New Page

- Bullet points list are always great in a presentation.
- As we don't want to overload our slides.
- Use a meaningful image to go alongside your information.



And if you need a clear division within the same slide, you can add a divider to your Confluence content and the line will look like this, using your brand's primary color.



Whitespace Is Nothing to Be Afraid Of

Using whitespace around your content like in this 3-column layout in the Confluence content can make it stand out on the page.

The text above is an H2 text style, by the way.



Do You Want to Create a Page Break?

Even when your slide is not full yet?

Use **scroll-page-break** macro within your Confluence content and consider it done!



An Image Is Worth a Thousand Words



Don't be afraid to use one whole slide for them.



And Whenever You Need Information to POP

Panel macros can come in handy for adding that extra touch of color.

You can style each panel differently within the template styles.

Remember, the rule #1 to creating a good presentation is...

To have fun, seriously!
